Activities, such as organizing a picnic, get-togethers, symposia, academic minor competitions etc. definitely help the students gathering information which is largely responsible for the overall shaping of a student's career. The college organizes regular workshops, Seminars, Conferences for a healthy exchange of thoughts. The Career-Counseling Cell conducts continual meetings with students to guide and chisel them up. The institution adopts all possible techniques to impart knowledge to the students.
