This college was established as Govt. Degree College Rajouri in 1981 with 73 students having few subjects of arts stream in a limited accommodation in DIET building Jawarharnagar Rajouri. Presently the college is catering knowledge to thousands of students(both Boys and Girls) in 26 subjects of science, arts, commerce, BCA and BBA streams at UG level and four subjects M. Sc Chemistry, M.C.A, M.A. Urdu and M.A. Arabic at PG level through an excellent team of 83 faculty members in a beautiful college campus situated at Kheora Rajouri. In addition to it, several skill enhancement and ability enhancement courses have already been started. The affiliation process of M.Sc Physics, M.Sc Geography and M.A English at PG level and Information Technology, Bio-Chemistry, Applied Mathematics at UG level with university of Jammu has been initiated.

The college is also imparting education to about 4000 students both in UG and PG through distance mode from recognized centers of Indira Gandhi National Open University(IGNOU), Moulana Azad National Urdu University (MANUU) and University of Jammu. College also runs some short time certificate courses. Since its inception it has not only been catering educational needs of this far-flung and hilly region of Jammu and Kashmir but has also excelled in academic and non academic sectors. Its Alumni are holding key positions in all the departments including Politics, Administration, Judiciary and Education. About 80% staff of this college are alumni of this prestigious institution.

College library is one of the best libraries of J&K with separate Arts Section, Science section, Reference Section, Career Counseling Cell and Reading Room. It is fully automated and linked with college website. It has collection of about 60000 books comprising of reference books, text books and general books. There is facility in the library to access online books and journals. The library has subscribed 15 Research Journals in addition to several magazines and Newspapers in it. Moreover college has subscribed N-List programme of Inflibnet Centre through which Books and Journals are accessible. Also our several students and staff are registered on National Digital Library of India. We have also Browsing Centre and UGC recourse centre where teachers and students can access Books and Journals online. We have also developed some labs which are research oriented.

For keeping the campus Green, it is permanent feature to conduct plantation drives in both the seasons that is Feb-March, and July-August. College has developed a very nice Botanical Garden. The Garden housed a good number of herbs, shrubs and trees of importance to cater the practical purposes of the students. A large number of lesser known rare and threatened plants species of mountainous range of Rajouri district huge medicinal and other botanical properties have been grown in it. Besides this a Mulberry Garden has also been developed to establish a sericulture unit to start sericulture as a separate subject in the college to make students self skilled.

College has been constructed at a plateau spreading its grandeur of buildings, lawns and grounds over almost 100 kanals of land, which houses four separate hostels for boys and girls and staff quarters apart from administrative block, lecture theatres, well equipped laboratories and a multipurpose hall to carry out extracurricular activities. The College has been accredited with "B" Grade with CGPA 2.41 by NAAC in 2019 and is still at S.No.1 in Jammu Division and at S.No.2 in J&K among all the colleges which has been accredited under new scheme of NAAC. This college was established as Govt. Degree College Rajouri in 1981 with 73 students having few subjects of arts stream in a limited accommodation in DIET building Jawarharnagar Rajouri. Presently the college is catering knowledge to thousands of students(both Boys and Girls) in science, arts, commerce, BCA and BBA streams at UG level and four subjects M. Sc Chemistry, M.C.A, M.A. Urdu and M.A. Arabic at PG level through an excellent team of 83 faculty members in a beautiful college campus situated at Kheora Rajouri. In addition to it, several skill enhancement and ability enhancement courses have already been started. The affiliation process of M.Sc Physics, M.Sc Geography and M.A English at PG level and Information Technology, Bio-Chemistry, Applied Mathematics at UG level with university of Jammu has been initiated.

Government P. G. College Rajouri is located at a small beautiful plateau at village Kheora, two and half kilo meters to the north of City of Kings, Rajouri town. College campus gives a picturesque look in the backdrop of snow capped Pir Panjal Mountain ranges of the Middle Himalayas in the far north. A monument of Mian Hathu's times Dhani Dhar Fort lies just to the east. In the west lies the Darhal Tawi a source tributary of Manawar Tawi and historic Rajouri town in the south.. College has gratitude at 33.25°N latitudes and 69.30°E longitude. College has been constructed at a plateau spreading its grandeur of buildings, lawns and grounds over almost 100 kanals of land, which houses four separate hostels for boys and girls and staff quarters apart from administrative block, lecture theatres, well equipped laboratories and a multi-purpose Hall to carryout co-curricular activities. The College has rich library having a collection of over 60000 volumes. The College also has departmental libraries for its PG Departments and several other departments also. Moreover, latest journals, magazines, periodicals etc. are also subscribed. In addition to the University sub-office, the college has three Distance Education Study Centres functioning under the aegis of Indira Gandhi National Open University New Delhi, Directorate of Distance Education, University of Jammu, Jammu and the Mualana Azad National Urdu University, Hyderabad for those students who cannot offer regular admissions. The College is NAAC reaccredited "B" Grade with CGPA2.41 in 2019. The College has constituted an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post accreditation quality sustenance measures. The Department of Science and Technology (DST) New Delhi has released grants to the tune of Rs. 69 lakh in November 2015 under FIST Programme 2014 for development of Lab. Infrastructure of all Science Departments. The College feels honoured on being recognized as College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) by the UGC New Delhi in April 2016 under the status of CPE. The Department of Botany and Zoology has started skill based vocational courses in Mushroom Cultivation, Apiculture, Sericulture and Green Farming from the Session 2015-16.

Special Features of the college: Higher Education is much essential for an accepted survival and sustained development of nations. Today's objective of Higher Education is not to go for quantitative expansion of literacy but its ultimate aim is quality-based life oriented education and proper management of its acquisition and the absence of the same is an obstacle on the way of Higher Education. 1. MASTER OF SCIENCE IN CHEMISTRY (M.Sc. Chemistry)

The College is running postgraduate course M. Sc. Chemistry since 2004-05. The Intake capacity is 20 students.

2. MASTER OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (MCA)

The college is running postgraduate course MASTER OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (MCA) since 2004-05. The Intake capacity is 19 students.

3. MASTER OF Urdu (M.A. Urdu)

The College is running postgraduate course in Urdu since 2019-20. The intake capacity is 30 students.

4. MASTER OF Arabic (M.A. Arabic)

The College is also starting postgraduate course M.A. Arabic f since this session 2020-21. The intake capacity is 30 students.

ADMISSION SCHEDULE & PROCEDURE FOR PG CLASSES

The selection is made through a common entrance test (JUET) conducted by the University of Jammu. The University announces its admission schedule every year and publishes in daily news papers also displays on the university website: www.jammuuniversity.in.

SEMESTER SYSTEM AT U. G. LEVEL:

Semester system has been introduced during 2014-15 session. In order to get graduation degree a student has to complete six semesters, two semesters in one academic year.

CHOICE-BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS):

From the session 2016-17 Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) has been introduced for the students seeking admission to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com/BCA/BBA Semester-I.

CBCS is a flexible system of learning that focuses from teacher centric to student centric education and permits students to

1. Choose electives from a wide range of elective courses offered by the college,
2. Adopt an inter-disciplinary approach in learning, and
3. Make best use of the expertise of available faculty.

PROGRAMME: 'Programme' means a course of study and examination leading to the award of a degree in a discipline. These Regulations shall apply to the following programmes: BA, BSc, BCA, B.Com and BBA.

COURSE: Course refers to a subject offered under the programme which will be taught and evaluated within a semester.

DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME: The programme shall be extended over a period of three years comprising of six semesters with two semesters in one academic year. Each semester shall consist of a minimum of 450 contact hours distributed over 90 working days spread over 15-16 weeks of six-day duration each and 4- 5 contact hours per day. The Semesters from July to December are Semesters I, III and V (called Odd Semesters) and from January to June are Semesters II, IV and VI (called Even Semesters)

CREDITS: Credit is the weightage given to each course of study. It is the numerical value assigned to a course according to the relative importance of the content and the contact hours required to teach the prescribed syllabi of the programme.

For the purpose of credit determination, instructions are divided into 3 components:

Lectures (L) : Classroom lectures of one hour duration.

Tutorials (T): Special elaborate instructions on specific topics of one hour duration.

Practicals (P): Laboratory work/Projects/Fieldwork/any other form of learning which the student has to undertake of two hours duration.

Therefore, **Credits (C) = L + T + P**, where one Lecture (L) and Tutorial (T) of one hour a week is considered as one credit and one Practical(P), two hours a week is considered as one credit.

As per prescribed UGC standards, **1Credit = 15 hours of lectures.**

The instructional days as worked out by the UGC for one academic year are 180 working days i.e. **90 days per semester.**

5. CREDIT POINT (P):

Credit point is the value obtained by multiplying the grade point (G) by the credit (C):

$$P = G \times C.$$

6. GRADE POINT:

Grade point is an integer indicating the numerical equivalent of the **letter grade.**

7. GRADE : Grade means a letter symbol (O,A,B,C etc.) which indicates the broad level of performance of a student in a course/semester/programme.

8 SEMESTER GRADE POINT AVERAGE (SGPA)*:

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is the value obtained by dividing the sum of credit points (P) earned by a student in various courses taken in a semester by the total number of credits earned by the student in that semester. SGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal places.

9 CUMULATIVE GRADE POINT AVERAGE (CGPA)*:

'Cumulative Grade Point Average' (CGPA) is the value obtained by dividing the sum of credit points in all the courses earned by a student for the entire programme, by the total number of credits. CGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal places. CGPA indicates the comprehensive academic performance of a student in a programme. An overall letter grade (Cumulative Grade) for the entire programme shall be awarded to a student depending on his/her CGPA.

GRADE CARD: Based on the grades earned, a grade card shall be issued to all registered students after every semester. The grade card will display the course details (course, title, no. of credits, etc.) along with SGPA of that semester and CGPA earned till that semester.

CBCS PROGRAMME STRUCTURE REGULATIONS:

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising **core, elective or skill based courses**.

1. Core Course: A course, which needs to be compulsorily studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

2 Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

3 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).

4 Project Work/Dissertation: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.

5 Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective.

6 Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)/Competency Improvement Courses/Skill Development Courses(SEC)/Foundation Course: The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: AE Compulsory Course (AECC) and AE Elective Course (AEEC)/Skill Enhancement Course(SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. They include (i) Environmental Science, (ii) English/MIL Communication). These are mandatory for all disciplines. AEEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

7 AE Compulsory Course (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/MIL Communication.

8 AE Elective Course (AEEC)/SEC: These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction.

9 Project work/Dissertation is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving / analyzing /exploring a real life situation / difficult problem. A Project/Dissertation work would be of 2/4 credits. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

CREDITS DISTRIBUTION

Courses having theory and practicals may incorporate 4 credits for theory paper and 2 credits for practicals (In case total credits are 6) and 2 credits for theory paper and 2 credits for practicals (In case total credits are 4) while courses having only practicals may have 2/4 credits as per the course requirement. Purely theory courses may incorporate 4 credits for theory and 2 credits for tutorials.

NOMENCLATURE OF UNDER GRADUATE COURSES

Nomenclature of courses shall be done in such a way that the course code shall consist of eight characters:

- The first character "**U**" stands for Under Graduate
- Next two characters will denote the course code
- Next character will signify the nature of the course(**T** for Theory, **P** for practical, **D** for project, **U** for tutorial)
- The succeeding character will denote whether the course is Core(**C**), Elective(**E**) or Skill/Ability Enhancement(**S**)
- The next character will denote the semester number
- Last two characters will denote the paper number

SUBJECTS OFFERING

- (a) Except in the case of Geology and Geography no candidate for the B.Sc. Semester-I examination, under the CBCS, shall take up any subject unless he had taken up same subject in Higher Secondary Part-II of 10+2 pattern or an equivalent examination, provided that a candidate having passed Higher Secondary Part-II examination with-
- (i) Biology as a subject will be eligible to take up Botany or Zoology or both
- (b) No candidate will offer Mathematics for B.A./B.Sc. Semester-I Course unless he/she has qualified the Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 pattern) examination with Mathematics.
- (c) No candidate will be admitted to the B.Com. Semester-I Course unless he/she has passed Higher Secondary Part-II (10+2 Pattern) examination with Commerce stream.

Provided that a candidate after having passed Higher Secondary Part-II examination in stream other than Commerce stream with at least 50% marks in the aggregate shall be allowed to seek admission to the B.Com. Semester-I.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION/ASSESSMENT:

The evaluation of each course shall contain two parts :Internal or In Semester Assessment (IA) and External or End-Semester Assessment (EA).The internal grade awarded to the students in each course in a semester shall be published on the notice board at least one week before the commencement of end semester examination. The responsibility of evaluating the internal assessment is vested on the teacher(s) who teaches the course. There will be University Examinations at the end of each semester for both theory and Practical .

20% of the marks allotted to each theory paper and 50% of the marks allotted to each practical paper including field work, wherever prescribed, shall be reserved for internal assessment. The evaluation of a candidate shall be awarded and record thereof maintained in accordance with the Regulations prescribed for the purpose under the CBCS as per the following:

Paper having theoretical content only

- (1) All 6 credits on lecture basis

Or

- (2) 4 Credits on lecture basis plus 2 Credits on tutorial basis

Paper having Practical Content

Four Credits on theory basis

Plus

Two credits on Practical basis

One Credit in case of theory and tutorial in one hour duration for fifteen working days (period) or 23 periods of 40 minutes duration.

One Credit in case of practical is two hour duration for fifteen working days or 45 period of 40 minutes duration

Theory Examinations

- Each theory paper/ Course shall be of 100 marks
- 20% of which shall be reserved for internal assessment
- 80% of which shall be reserved for External Examinations to be conducted by the University/ Colleges.
- The External Examination in theory shall consist of following

1. Five (5) short Answer representing all units/syllabi i.e. at least one from each Unit (without details explanation) of 4 marks each = 20 (No choice all compulsory).
 2. Three (3) short Answer (without detail explanation) of 8 marks each = 24 (All compulsory)
 3. Four (4) Long answer only two to be attempted (with analysis/Explanation or critical analysis/ evaluation) and the question should be set one from one unit/sub topic only so as to cover the maximum units/ topics in the syllabus.
- Time duration 2 ½ hours only.

Internal Assessment

The internal assessment under choice Based Credit System shall comprise two parts.

Part A: Total weight age to this part shall be 50% of internal assessment marks i.e. 10% of the total marks or 10 marks out of 20 marks reserved for internal assessment. It will have eight short questions selecting at least three from each of the two/three units (50% of syllabus) covered. A Candidate has to attempt any five and each question carries 2 marks.

Part B: Total weight to this part shall be 50% of the internal assessment marks i.e. 10% of the total marks or 10 marks out of 20 marks reserved for internal assessment. It will have 2 Long questions, selecting one each from first two units/50% of the syllabus. A Candidate has to attempt any one question and the question shall carry 10 marks

Total marks in case of project work shall be divided into 80 percent for project work and 20 percent for presentation/ Viva-Voce

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY FOR APPEARANCE IN EXAMINATION

A semester end external examination for B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(General)/ BBA/BCA/Honours course, under CBCS, shall be open to the following categories of students :

(A) A regular student i.e. a student who has undergone a regular course of study in a college for the period specified for that course of study by having been on the rolls of the college immediately preceding the examination and has his/her name submitted to the Controller of Examinations by the college Principal where he/she has pursued the course for the examination and has fulfilled the following conditions to be certified by the college Principal concerned:

- (i) he/she has been a student of good conduct.
- (ii) he/she has attended not less than 75% of the lecture delivered including seminars, tutorials etc in each course opted by him/her in that semester.

(iii) he/she has passed in internal assessment.

(iv) in the case of laboratory course/practicals, he/she has attended not less than 75% of the practical classes conducted (practicals include field studies, workshop practice, map work, surveying etc.).

(v) he/she has paid the prescribed fee.

CONDONATION OF LECTURES

The Principal of College concerned may condone shortage of a student in attendance in a semester for special reasons, to be recorded in writing upto 6% of the lectures delivered or practicals conducted in each course separately. A student whose deficiency in lectures/practicals in a course is not condoned by the Principal of College or is not condonable, shall not be eligible to appear in the semester examination of CBCS in that course but shall be permitted to appear in the subsequent semester examination if he/she remains on the rolls of the College as a regular student and attends the required number of lectures delivered from the date of classification or the date on which he/she has joined whichever is earlier upto the semester and provided that the number of lectures he/she attended is not less than the number by which he/she fall short of attendance in the subject(s).

Provided also that no condonation, whatsoever, shall be allowed to deficiency in lectures for admission to the subsequent semester examination.

Provided further also that in case such a student again falls short of lectures he/she shall not be allowed to seek admission to that course in any affiliated college in any subsequent year.

A student who does not fulfil the minimum requirement of attendance in lectures/practicals in a course will not be eligible to sit in the semester examination in that course. Such a student will have to repeat the course when the classes in that course are held by the college.

A student who has been on the rolls of a college in the Semester-I, II, III, IV & V of B.A./B.Sc./ B.Com./BBA/BCA/Honours course and earns eligibility to join the Semester-II or III or IV or V of the programme as the case may be, but fails to join the semester when he/she was due to join it or discontinues his/her studies for any reason whatsoever may be considered for admission to the semester concerned in a subsequent year if he/she submits application to this effect before the commencement of the semester concerned provided a seat and other facilities for the courses offered by the student are available in the college concerned in the semester he/she wishes to join and the student seeks admission within a period of one year from the date he/she discontinue his/her studies.

EXEMPTION TO RE-APPEAR IN PRACTICAL EXAMINATION ONCE QUALIFIED

A candidate who appears and passes in the practical examination (separately in the internal assessment and the University examination) of a subject but fails to qualify in that subject shall be exempted from appearing in the practical examination of that subject subsequently and the marks obtained by him/her in the last attempt in which he/she passed in the practical examination of a subject shall be carried over. Consequently, he/she shall be required to appear in the theory part of that subject at the subsequent examination.

PASSING CRITERION

The minimum Grade /Grade Point required to pass each paper in a semester examination under CBCS shall be **Grade D / Grade Point 4** in each theory paper/ Practical/Project (wherever applicable) in External Examination and Internal Assessment separately

DETERMINATION OF GRADES (Grading System and Computation of SGPA, CGPA)

Grading System: Absolute grading would be used where the marks obtained are converted to grades based on pre-determined class intervals. To implement the following grading system, the colleges /campuses shall use the following UGC recommended 10-point grading system:

V. A student obtaining Grade F shall be considered failed and will be required to reappear in the examination as per existing rules of the university under Semester System for Under Graduate Courses.

- (ii) Grade (D) or percentage of marks (36%) is required to pass in a course, SGPA of 4 to qualify a semester and a minimum CGPA of 4 to qualify for a UG degree.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION in BA/B.Sc/B.com/BCA/BBA Semester-I

A. B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(General) Course

The B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (General) Course Semester-I examination under the CBCS shall be open to a candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary Part-II examination (10+2 Pattern) of the Jammu and Kashmir State Board of School Education or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto in all subjects.

B. Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) Course

Admission to Semester-I of BBA course, under CBCS, shall be open to those candidates who have passed Higher Secondary Part-II examination (under 10+2 pattern) of the J&K State Board of School Education or an examination recognized by the University as equivalent thereto and has obtained not less than 50% of the aggregate marks in the qualifying examination in case of General Category candidates and 45% marks in case of SC/ST candidates.

C. Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) Course.

Admission to Semester-I of BCA course, under CBCS, shall be open to those candidates who have passed Higher Secondary Part-II examination (under 10+2 pattern) of the J&K State Board of School Education or an examination recognized by the University as equivalent thereto with Mathematics as one of the elective subjects and has obtained not less than 50% of the aggregate marks in the qualifying examination in case of General Category and 45% marks in case of SC/ST candidates.

ATTENDANCE IN LIEU OF PARTICIPATION IN GAMES ETC

Any candidate who participates in games, cultural and other co-curricular activities as defined below with the prior approval of the Principal shall, for the purpose of condoning deficiency in attendance incurred by him/her on account of such participation, be treated as present on all the working days during the days of his/her absence on such account for a period not exceeding 15 working days in a semester programme subject to maximum of 30 working days in an year.

- (a) State representation in International/All India Competitions organized by agencies which are recognized by the Board of Sports and Youth Welfare.
- (b) Participation in the Inter-University Competitions held under the auspices of a University or any other recognized Institution as a member of the University team.
- (c) Participation in the Inter-College Competitions organized by the University as a member of the team of participating Institutions.
- (d) Participation in the N.C.C., N.S.S. and National Integration Samiti activities as a member of recognized Institutions.
- (e) Participation in the Coaching Camps/Rehearsals prior to participation as a member of State or University team in the National/All India/ Inter- University Competitions.
- (f) Participation in the Mountaineering/Hiking/Trekking/Skiing/Rock-Climbing or other such activities Organized under the auspices of the State Government/University as a member of the Institution affiliated/recognized by the University.

Note: For Outstanding cases special permission may be sought from the Vice Chancellor/Competent Authority on recommendation of the Principal.

PAYMENT OF ADMISSION FEE

Each student seeking admission to the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.B.A)/B.C.A. under CBCS, shall be required to submit the prescribed application form along with requisite fee:

- (i) for the first and second semester courses at the time of seeking admission to first semester;
- (ii) (ii) for the third and fourth semester courses at the time of seeking admission to the third semester;
- (iii) for the fifth and sixth semester courses at the time of seeking admission to the fifth semester.

Provided the student continues his/her studies without interruption from first semester to second semester, from third semester to fourth semester and from fifth to sixth semester. If there is a gap of one or more semesters he/she will have to fill up the prescribed application form and pay the fee at the time of seeking admission.

INFRASTRUCTURE, LEARNING RESOURCES AND FACILITIES, NCC, NSS, Library, Women Development Cell, Hostels

FACILITIES AVAILABLE FOR CURRICULAR, CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

I) CLASSROOMS:

Our college has 20 spacious class rooms (out of which 14 are smart rooms) with proper light arrangement and ventilation, Dias and Podium, seating arrangement with proper visibility for both students and teachers and attractive white and green boards.

LABORATORIES:

The College has nineteen well equipped laboratories, four in Chemistry Department, three in Geography Department two each in Physics, Zoology and Botany Departments and one each in Biotechnology and Geology Departments, for the conduct of science practicals which facilitate students to conduct regular practicals during the session and in annual examinations. College has one Language Digital Lab also. Similarly, the college has five technology enabled laboratories (two in computer department and one each in Departments of Physics, Chemistry and Geography for conducting computer based practicals.

II) CENTRAL LIBRARY:

The Central Library of College has a collection of about 60,000 books, comprising of reference, text and general books. Reading room and book bank facility is available for the benefit of students and staffs. A research division is established in the library for researcher and budding scholars of the College. The College has subscribed several magazines, newspapers and journals which remain available in the library reading room. The College Library is fully atomized which is linked with the College website www.gpgcollegerajouri.ac.in.

III) DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARY

College has two departmental libraries one in the P.G. Department of Chemistry and the other in P.G. Department of Computer Sciences to facilitate the needs of M. Sc Chemistry and MCA students respectively. Several other departments are also developing Departmental Libraries.

LIBRARY RULES:

- The Library observes the same working hours and holidays as the College has. However, it remains open for the students during the summer vacations from 8:30 AM to 7:30PM.
2. Every student at the time of borrowing books from the Library shall produce his/her Identity Card. A person borrowing books from the Library shall be held responsible for any loss of pages or damage of the book and he/she will have to pay fine in addition to double the cost of that book.
 3. Teachers are not allowed to take more than ten books at a time. No member of the College staff may borrow books from the Library on his own name for the use of the students.

4. Members of the College staff or the establishment at the time of leaving the College or transfer, retirement or otherwise shall return all the books borrowed by them before the LPC or "No Demand" certificate is issued in his/her favour.
5. Students can borrow only one book at a time, which include at least one book of the subject taken by him/her.
6. Students must return books taken by them within fifteen days. Any student retaining a book after the time allowed shall have to pay a fine of Rs. 1/- per day until the same is returned, provided the fine incurred shall not exceed double the cost of the book.
7. The Librarian shall keep a record of the book issued. In the beginning of every month or at the time of realization of dues to the cashier, librarian shall submit to the office a list of fine imposed on students for late return of books. Those students shall have to deposit the fine with the College cashier within seven days of the submission of the list, failing which the student will not be allowed to attend the classes.
8. Books required by teachers of the College, if borrowed by any other person, must be returned on the receipt of a notice issued from the librarian.
9. The same person shall not be allowed to borrow any book for the second time within two days from date of its return by him/her. This rule, however, does not apply to Teachers of the College.
10. Any person, who either loses a book or otherwise damages it, shall be liable to pay an amount not less than double the cost of the book. When it belongs to a set or series, and unless he can replace it, he shall be liable to pay the cost of the whole set or series.
11. Students free from lecture work may visit the Library during the college hours. No talking or disturbance of any kind is allowed in the library. Any infringement of rules shall incur punishment/fine.
12. Library is meant only for the use of those persons who are directly or indirectly connected with the academic life of the College.
13. Books of the following description shall not be issued by the library.
 - a. Reference Books
 - b. Periodicals/Magazines
 - c. Dictionaries of prominence.
 - d. Encyclopaedia/Census Reports
 - e. Rare books identified by College Library Committee/Principal.
14. Periodicals shall not be issued except for consultation in the library premises.
15. All books shall have to be returned to the library every year at the time of stock checking especially in April-May. The librarian shall make a report of books found damaged/missing to the principal, soon after the stock checking is over and shall prepare the list of books to be written off.
16. Teachers of the College, who wish to retain certain books during the summer vacation, shall have to return the same to the library at the time of stock checking.
17. Sleeping, smoking, chatting, eating, mobile phones and discussion etc. are strictly prohibited in the library.

BOTANICAL GARDEN:

Our college has a well maintained botanical garden where the students study various plants and other aspects of botanical life which facilitates them in enriching their knowledge.

IV) SEMINAR HALLS:

- V) The college has two seminar halls (one each in Department of Computer Sciences and Chemistry). These halls are regularly used for conducting class seminars. The students of post graduate departments are regularly promoted for active involvement in paper presentations, group discussions & class seminars etc.

VI) SPECIALIZED FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT FOR TEACHING, LEARNING AND RESEARCH:

The college has five computer labs with 94 computers. The staff is given a free access to internet so that they can enrich their knowledge and then in turn the students can be benefitted from their experiences and knowledge.

The computerized library also helps the staff and the students to understand the value of research and knowledge.

College has UGC network resource centre with twelve computers where students and staff access the internet.

VII) SPORTS:

College has sports block located behind Computer Sciences Department.

OUTDOOR AND INDOOR GAMES:

The college has following facilities for outdoor games:

VIII) GYMNASIUM:

Our college has well equipped Gymnasium with all the modern equipments for the maintenance of personal health and hygiene.

IX) AUDITORIUM:

The college is having a multipurpose hall for organising all type of programmes & special seminars. The seating capacity of the hall is around 300 students

X) NSS:

The College has two units of **NSS**, each consisting of 100 volunteers. Each unit functions under a programme officer. The students have to apply on a prescribed form for seeking admission to each unit at the beginning of the session. Students enrolled as NSS volunteers are required to put in at least 120 hours of social work and attend one camp of 10 days duration in one session to become eligible to receive a certificate. The special camp at University level and a National Integration camp are also arranged every year, generally during summer/winter vocation.

XI) NCC:

To stimulate interest in the defence of the Nation and to build up a reservoir of man power for the Armed Forces. The College has two units of NCC, consisting of 100 Male Cadet and 60 Female Cadet.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Every enrolled NCC cadet has to undergo two parades of two hours each week and is required to attend 45 parades in a year.
- All cadets require 75% attendance in parades for eligibility.
- Enrolled cadets have also to attend camps.
- The uniforms are issued by the College and to be returned at the end of the academic session to the officers' incharge, failing which the permission will not be accorded to appear in the University Examinations.
- 'B' and 'C' certificate examinations held annually for cadets in 2nd and 3rd year of NCC training respectively.
- Misbehaviour and misconduct in NCC activities can debar the cadet from appearing in the University Examinations.

XII) YOGA:

The College has established a Yoga Centre in Physical Education Block, equipped with all necessary facilities and study material.

WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL/WOMEN STUDY CENTRE: Centre for women's development is functional in this college under the aegis of UGC from 2004 with an objective to conduct training programmes, seminars and workshops in collaboration with different agencies and institutions associated directly or indirectly with formulation, execution and implementation of various policies and programmes for gender improvement and

development. In addition to this the centre arranges advocacy and legal awareness extension and field outreach camps/activities.

College has set up UGC-NRC for students and teachers of the College. In the Centre students/teacher can access internet.

Moreover, College has subscribed N-List programme of Inflibnet Centre through which more than 50000 Books and Journals are accessible.

EDUSAT:

The College has Edu-Sat facility through which students attend online classes delivered by expert teachers in the Edu-Sat hub.

XIV) FIRST AID CELL :

The college runs a first aid cell to facilitate immediate medical assistance to students and staff. A doctor is deputed weekly from district hospital Rajouri to visit the first aid centre of the college for free medical checkup of the students.

XV) ECO- CLUB

Govt. P. G. College Rajouri has established an Eco-Club for the development of Eco-Friendly Environment in the state in general and Rajouri District in particular. Club organizes the functions like Environment awareness, wild life protection, WWF functioning and other related pollution free/Polythene free life style.

XVI) COLLEGE CANTEEN

COLLEGE HAS A SUBSIDIZED CANTEEN which provides snacks and light refreshment to the students at subsidized rates. The college has a canteen committee which keeps an eye on the working of the canteen. As and when any change or reform is required, the committee immediately comes into action.

XVII) COLLEGE HOSTELS

Hostel facility is available for 100 male students in General Boys Hostel and SC Boys Hostel and 50 female students in SC Hostel for girls. Students desirous of seeking admission to the Hostels must apply on the proper Application Form which can be had from the Hostel Wardens free of cost. Hostels are equipped with internet (wifi) facilities, newspaper and well furnished infrastructure.

HOSTEL RULES

1. Boarders will be required to sign the receipts for the items of furniture and other things issued to them. They will be responsible for any damage to doors, windows, glass panes, furniture, almirahs and fittings and other hostel property.
2. Meals are served in the 'Dining Hall' only. No one is allowed to cook meals in his/her room.
3. The Hostel Mess is run by the contractor/ on co-operative basis, managed by the Mess Committee, comprising Boarders and respective Wardens.
4. Mess charges must be cleared by the 10th of each month.
5. The boys hostels gates are opened at 5:00 AM in summer and 6:00 AM in the winter and are **closed at 10:00 PM in summer and 8:00 PM in the winter**. Gates can be opened during the night only in case of an emergency. No boarder shall be allowed to move out after the attendance is taken at night.
6. The girls' hostel gates are opened at 6:00 AM in summer and 8:00 AM in the winter and are **close at 7:30 PM in summer and 6:00 PM in the winter. No girl will leave the hostel premises without the written permission of the Warden.**
7. The hostlers are responsible for the safety of their belongings. Those breaking the rules are liable to be fined and such articles left on the premises may be confiscated during vacation.
8. The hostel authorities shall not be responsible for the loss or theft of any cash or valuables kept in the rooms of the boarders.

9. No boarder is allowed to any amusement which is likely to disturb other boarders.
10. Ragging in the hostels is strictly prohibited. Any student of the hostel indulging in ragging is liable to be expelled from the hostel as well as from the College.
11. Any refundable dues shall be released only after all due payments have been made by a boarder. The claim for all such refunds should be made within six months from the date of leaving the hostel.
12. The College authorities reserve the right to modify any of the existing rules without prior notice. Decision of the Principal in all matters shall be final and binding.

Note: The Principal has the authority to amend/add/delete any of the rules given in this information Brochure without any notice or specifying any reason, thereof.

XXXI) CAREER COUNSELLING CELL

The College has established an active Guidance and Counselling Cell with aims to journey with students in their lives by helping them in securing employment, selection of courses, study habit and overall offer insight, guidance and support to help students to understand and manage different career and life style issues. There is a proposal to start coaching classes for entrance tests of professional courses and other competitive exams conducted by PSC and UPSC.

XXXII) STUDENT GRIEVANCES CELL

A grievances cell has been established in the College CAMPUS. The student approach to the cell to voice their grievances or may send his/her grievance to the principal over mail gdcrajouri@gmail.com or put the note in the Grievances Box, located near the principal office. The cell redresses the grievances by sorting out the problems promptly and judiciously.

Hence all the students are impressed upon to bring their issues/problems/grievances to the notice of the Student Grievance Cell. The grievances cell should pertain to the jurisdiction of our college preferably.

XXXIII) PLACEMENT UNIT

College has UDAAN Cell, under the Special Industry Initiative of the Prime Minister, the National Skills Development Corporation (NSDC) and Ministry of Home Affairs have been mandated to work with the corporate sector in bringing about a positive change in the employment and skills space of Jammu and Kashmir. The Special Industry Initiative, known as “UDAAN”, targets the youths of J&K, specifically graduates and postgraduates, who are seeking global and local opportunities. UDAAN thereby aims to provide skills to 40 000 youth over a period of 5 years in high growth sectors. UDAAN has two objectives:

- To provide exposure to the graduates and post graduates of Jammu and Kashmir to the best of corporate India and
- To provide corporate India with exposure to the rich talent pool available in the state

XXXIV) YOUTH WELFARE ACTIVITIES

The college has a Debating Society and Cultural/Literary Club to plan, organize and regulate student welfare programmes and activities including cultural and literary programmes, festivals, camps, extension lectures, youth club and societies etc.

XXXV) COLLEGE MAGAZINE

Every year the college **publishes a Magazine “Raz-e-War”** which offers an excellent opportunity to students to express their views and show their literary talent.

XXXVI) News Letter

News Letter is also published to familiarize all the stakeholders with academic and non-academic programmes of the institution.

XXXVII) **Wall MAGAZINE & Newsletter are also available in the college where students creativity is displayed.**

XXXVIII) TOURS AND PICNICS

Annual Educational Tour, Subject Tours, Hiking and Trekking expeditions are also organized from time to time.

XXXIX) **PRIZES, MEDALS AND CERTIFICATES OF MERIT:**

Students with outstanding performance in the curricular and extra-curricular activities of the college are awarded prizes / medals / certificates of merit.

SCHOLARSHIP AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Number of scholarships and financial assistance as detailed below are given by various agencies to students of the following categories.

1. Scholarships for SC/ST/RBA/OBC/Pahari students
2. Scholarships for Physically Handicapped
4. Minority scholarships

In addition to the above-mentioned scholarships, Financial Assistance is given to the deserving poor students by the college out of the Students' Aid Fund. However, the criteria for the financial assistance to the deserving students are decided by the concerned committee appointed for the purpose on the basis of guidelines issued by the Government.

Students are required to apply for various Scholarships or Financial Assistance on the prescribed application form. The scholarship and financial assistance are, however, awarded to deserving students subject to the following conditions:

- (a) A good conduct
- (b) Satisfactory progress report in the studies
- (c) Regularity in attendance
- (d) A report of the tutor in-charge
- (e) Income/Category certificates issued by the competent authority.

Guardians of the students applying for any scholarship must give an undertaking that in case his/her ward participates in strikes or any other subversive activities, he/she will refund the amount of the scholarship received by his/her ward in one instalment.

In no case a student will get more than one scholarship in a year.

(c) CERTIFICATES TO BE SUBMITTED:

A student seeking admission should present himself/herself personally along with the parent/guardian to the college and shall present the following documents.

IN CASE OF REGULAR CANDIDATES:

1. Marks certificates in original of the qualifying examination (along with four attested copies).
2. Provisional/character certificates in original from the Head of the Institution last attended.
3. Date of Birth Certificate – Secondary School certificate issued by J&K State Board of School Education.
4. Three copies of the passport size photographs.
5. Category certificate, income certificate from the Competent Authority (only for those who want to apply for scholarship/financial assistance).
6. The undertaking in the form of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 10/- dully attested by Notary as mentioned in Annexure-I.

IN CASE OF PRIVATE CANDIDATES:

The candidates who have passed their qualifying examination as a private candidate shall have to submit the following documents in addition to the above:

1. An undertaking in the form of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 10/- dully attested by Notary as mentioned in Annexure-II.

2. Provisional certificate from J&K State Board of School Education and a character certificate from a first class magistrate / Dy SP (Police) of that area in the case of private candidates.

However, the students who have passed their qualifying examination from an institution other than the J&K State Board of School Education shall have to submit the following documents in addition to the above:

1. Migration Certificate in original from the University/Board from which the student has passed the qualifying examination.
2. Eligibility Certificate from the University of Jammu.
3. The undertaking in the form of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 10/- duly attested by Notary as mentioned in Annexure-III.

A student is permitted to take the university examination subject to the fulfilment of the following eligibility requirements.

- (a) The student pays the university examination fee at the time of submission of the examination form.
- (b) A student cannot sit in the university examination unless he/she has attended 75% of the total lectures delivered during the session in each theory subject and a minimum of 30 practical sessions in each science subject involving practical.

COLLEGE RULES

GENERAL RULES

1. **Ragging in any form, on or off the College Campus, including the Hostel is a cognizable offence and the students involved in ragging will be severely punished, even to the extent of being expelled from the College.**
2. Use of all sorts of drug/smoking is strictly prohibited.
3. **No outsider is allowed to enter the college without a valid reason.**
4. If a student remains absent from the College without permission for more than twenty days, his/her name shall be struck off from the College rolls.
5. Unlawful assembly of students in the college is banned.
6. Writing of graffiti on the walls or sticking of posters is a cognizable offence.
7. A student desirous of withdrawing his/her name from the college rolls should submit an application, countersigned by the parent/guardian of the student. The withdrawal certificate shall be issued only after the student clears all College dues. Such students shall in no case be readmitted during the same academic session.
8. Any student, who indulges in any indiscipline in the College, shall not be eligible for any prize, certificate, College Colour awards or scholarship from the Institution. This shall apply to all the students including NCC cadets, NSS volunteers, players or the hostellers.
9. **Use and possession of mobile by the students is totally banned on the College campus.**
10. The College Authorities reserve the right to change, modify or suspend the rules as and when required.
11. Not more than 15 duties in all shall be given to a student who has participated in Sports/NSS or any other extra-curricular activities of the college during a semester.
12. **ANY STUDENT FOUND INDULGING IN ANY UNDESIRABLE ACTIVITY IN THE COLLEGE SHALL BE DEALT WITH UNDER RULES EVEN TO THE EXTENT OF RUSTICATION FROM THE COLLEGE.**

Note: Wearing of college uniform shall be compulsory for all students. However, in unavoidable circumstances or cases where uniform requires exemption, special permission for exemption shall have to be sought from the College Principal. Uniform shall be compulsory on all working days.

I-CARD

IDENTITY CARDS

1. Every student on being admitted shall be issued an Identity Card which he/she will carry on at all times and shall produce on demand by any member of the college staff anywhere within the College premises.
2. The loss of the Identity Card should be reported immediately.
3. A new identity card shall not ordinarily be issued. However, after proper verification a duplicate card may be issued on payment of Rs. 100/- accompanied by an undertaking/affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 5/- duly attested by a Magistrate/Notary.
4. Identity Card must be returned at the end of each session failing which an amount of Rs. 200/- shall be charged, along with the requisite undertaking/affidavit.

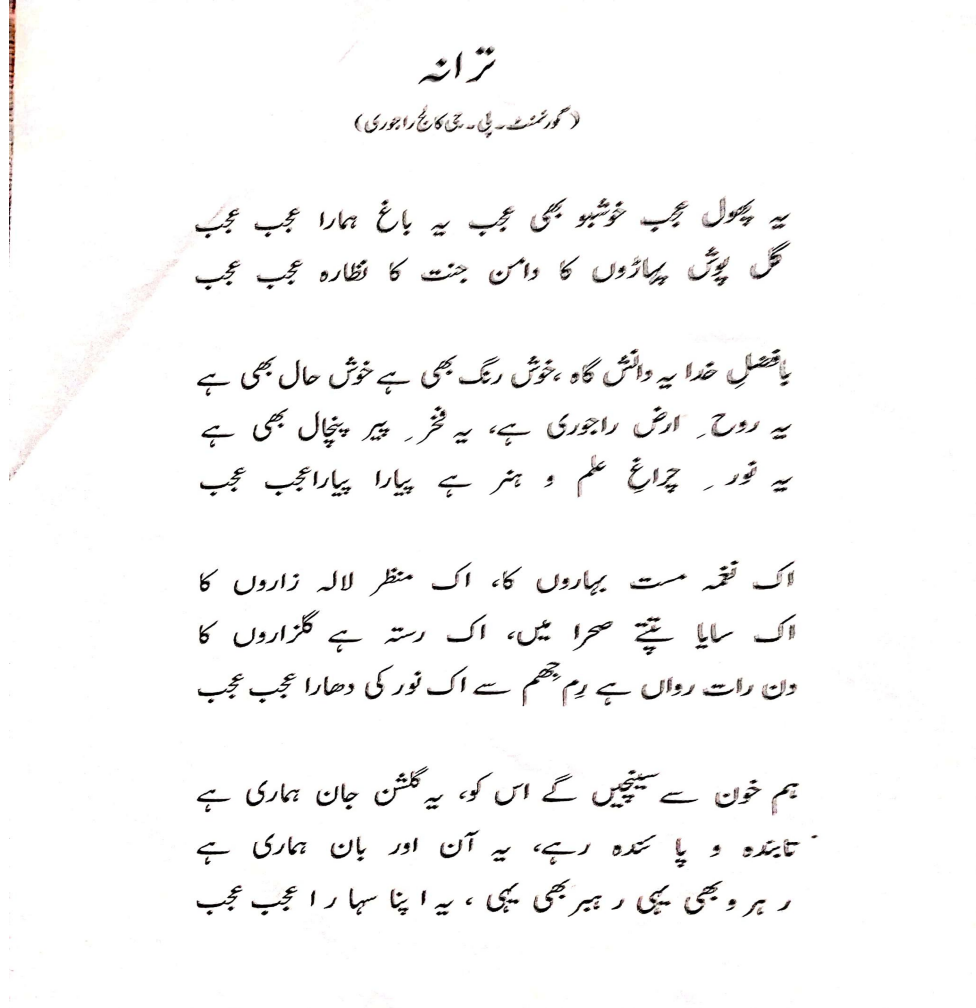
